This week in Preschool, we have been thinking about adventures! We talked about where we might like to go and what we would need to pack for our journey. In RE, we have been learning about how we can all be friends of Jesus and follow in His footsteps by trying to act like Him in our daily lives. In Maths, we have been practising counting larger numbers and developing our counting skills. We have also been working on selecting and counting the correct number of objects from a larger group.



This week in Reception, we have enjoyed talking about our families and sharing what makes each family special. The children created beautiful button family pictures, carefully arranging buttons to represent the members of their families. In RE, we have been learning about Saint Peter and Saint Paul. We discovered how they became friends of Jesus and dedicated their lives to spreading His Good News to others. The children enjoyed listening to their stories and discussing how they showed faith, courage and friendship.



Year 1 have worked incredibly hard during their Phonics Screening Check this week, and we are so proud of the effort and determination they have shown. Well done, Year 1!

In Geography, we have been learning about the seven continents. The children especially enjoyed exploring different globes of the world and joining in with our fun continent song to help them remember their names.



This week, Year 2 have been exploring African art, focusing on the vibrant work of Martin K. Bulinya. We studied how Bulinya depicts the Maasai people in a variety of poses and everyday situations, using bold colours and expressive compositions. In Geography, we have also been learning about the Maasai tribe, developing our understanding of their culture and way of life. Inspired by Bulinya's artwork, the children created their own paintings in his distinctive style, carefully using colour, shape and movement to capture scenes featuring Maasai people.

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UN Convention — Rights of the Child.

Through discussions, activities and group work, the children explored the rights that every child should enjoy, including the right to education, protection, healthcare and having their voices heard. They reflected on the importance of fairness, respect and responsibility, and considered how they can help to uphold the rights of others. We have been incredibly impressed!



This week, Year 4 celebrated World Oceans Day by taking part in a live lesson with Deadly 60's Steve Backshall, where they explored ocean habitats, life beneath the waves, and the importance of conservation.

The children also created posters encouraging others to love and protect our oceans, and help save our planet. Additionally, we would like to say a huge well done to all of our Year 4 pupils for completing their Multiplication Check this week. We are incredibly proud of all their hard work and effort.



This week in Year 5, we have been learning our new song, "Count on Me". We spoke about what genre of music it is classed as, what instruments we could hear and the lovely message that the song spreads. The children played and sang beautifully as part of an ensemble.



Year 6 have had a busy week with rehearsals fully underway for our end of year production 'Gigglebox'. All children have been working really hard rehearsing their lines and learning the songs.

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Pentecost Service

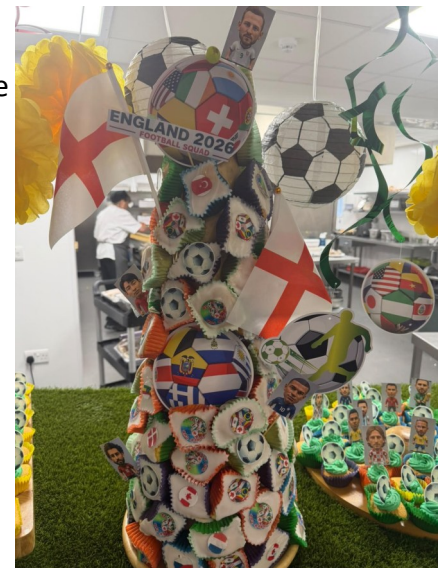
A wonderful moment for our Choristers who sang during a joint service with the Anglican Cathedral.
