This Year 2 have been working on adding and subtracting tens from a 2-digit number. We used manipulatives to develop our understanding further.

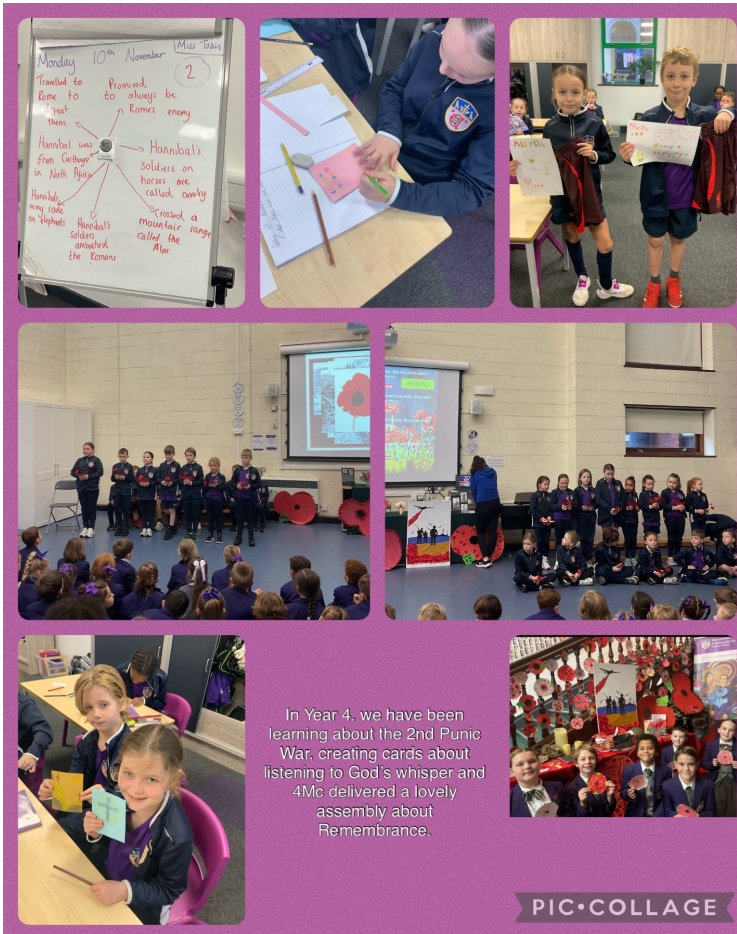
